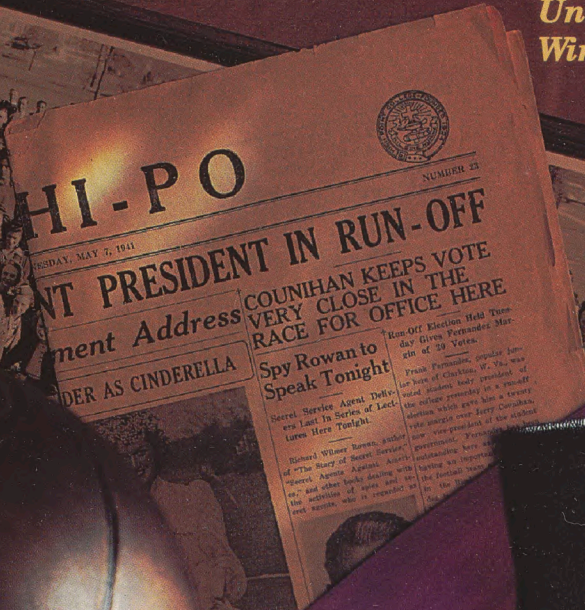
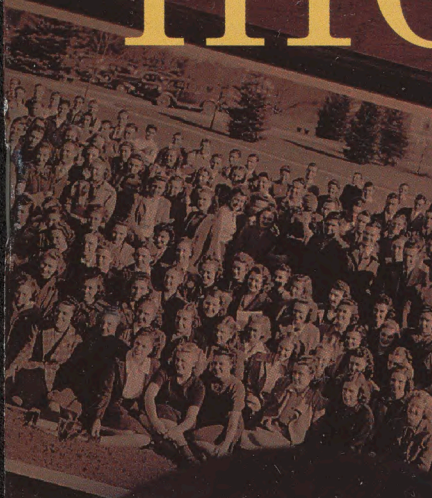

1993 Alumni Awards Banquet

Alumni, family and friends gathered Saturday, November 5 for the Annual Alumni Awards Banquet.

Harry Hauser '43 opened the evening with the invocation. Alumni Association President, **Norris Woody '79** gave his words of welcome. **Murphy Osborne '58**, alumnus and former administrator, shared memories of the past and hopes for the future of High Point University.

Bob Rankin, a member of the Board of Trustees at High Point University since 1973, was selected as Alumnus of the Year by the High Point University Alumni Association.

Rankin, a partner in BB&T/Ervin-Haywood-Rankin, a general insurance agency, graduated from High Point College in 1938. A former member of the High Point City Council, Rankin has played a major role in the development and growth of the High Point Jaycees, the High Point Museum and Historical Society, the High Point Theatre and Exhibition Center and the High Point Rotary Club.

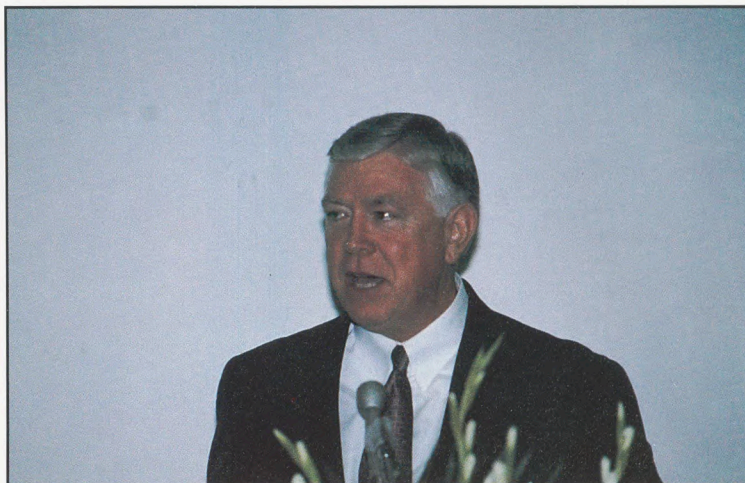
Rankin was also named High Point's Citizen of the Year in 1978.

Darrell Sechrest of Greensboro was awarded an alumni service medal for service to the university, while **Dr. John Ward** was honored posthumously with an alumni service medal for service to the alumni association. Ward's wife, Louella, accepted the award.

Sechrest is a 1942 graduate of High Point and actively serves on the university's Board of Visitors.

Ward was chairman of the Department of Biology at the university, was an active member the alumni association, and had served as a professor at High Point since 1970.

Roger Soles, former chairman of the Board of Trustees, and **Louise Mandrell**, long-time friend of the University, were given Honorary Alumni status in recognition of their outstanding dedication and service to the university.

High Point University Celebrates ...

Rain showers did not dampen the spirit of High Point University alumni who turned out in large numbers for Homecoming 1993 activities on November 5-6.

The High Point University Alumni Open golf tournament kicked off homecoming activities on Friday morning. Despite soggy playing conditions, a record field of 67 players, including alumni, parents, university staff members and friends, tackled High Point's challenging Oak Hollow Golf Course layout, which was designed by world-famous architect Pete Dye and is ranked among the top 100 public golf courses in the United States.

Teams were formed and a captain's choice format was used for the tournament. The team of Dave Hardison, Bob Aydelette, and John Caldwell fired a tournament-record 17-under-par 55 to edge the second-place team of Murphy Osborne,

Earl Crow, Bobby Hayes, and John Lefler by three shots. In the seniors division, the team of Kent Moseley, Jack Powell, Paul Stanton, and Jack Stanback shot 63 to win first-place honors.

The musical production "Perfectly Frank," performed by the High Point University Tower Players under the direction of professor Ron Law, attracted over 1,200 people to Memorial Auditorium during the weekend and played to positive reviews.

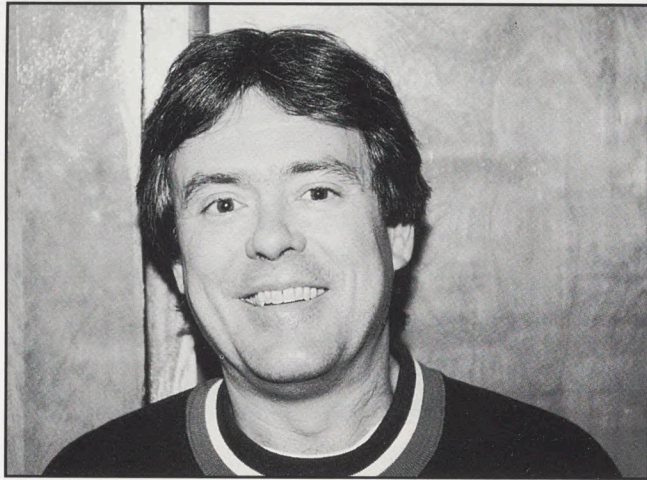

Law Selected as Finalist

"The Legend of Tom Dooley," a screenplay written by Ron Law, assistant professor and director of theater at High Point University, has been selected as a finalist in the prestigious 1993 America's Best Screenplay competition sponsored by The Writers Foundation.

The script, set during the Civil War era and inspired by the famous folk song, was selected as a semifinalist from more than 3,000 entries. Among the 50 semifinalists, Law's is the only script written by a North Carolina writer.

Ten winners will be announced within the next few weeks, Law said, and the top prize is \$25,000. "But even bigger is the validation, the recognition that comes with winning this competition," he said.

Following a great deal of research, Law dramatized the mysterious events surrounding the infamous fiddle player and Civil War veteran who was hanged for the murder of one of his lovers, Laura Foster. The screenplay centers on the love triangle which consisted of Dooley, Laura Foster and Laura's cousin, the beautiful Ann Foster.

Law is currently seeking an agent for the script and eventually someone to produce it.

The 1993 America's Best Screenplay competition is a nationwide competition designed to spotlight and promote the best writers and their material for film. Judging is based on concept, story structure, characterization, dialogue and pacing. Judges are professionals working in the entertainment and publishing industry (agents, production and studio personnel, and editors).

The Writers Foundation, dedicated to supporting and encouraging writers of all disciplines, is determined to focus attention on the importance of writers in our society and the immense contributions they make.

High Point to Help Local Teachers

High Point University has received a grant of \$28,800 to help improve science instruction in Thomasville City Schools.

The university will help Thomasville teachers transform the way they teach science. The education department will develop leadership teams to create new approaches.

"The focus of these grants is ultimately to reach the students," said Barbara Leonard, project director and assistant professor of education at High Point University.

It is hoped that students will find classes more stimulating after the university/teacher teams have finished their work.

"What we hope for is more hands-on (instruction) by the students, that teachers would be facilitators rather than lecturers as they interact with the science curriculum," Leonard said.



The university will provide trainers from its staff to set up the teams in grades K-8 at Thomasville Primary, Liberty Drive Elementary, and Thomasville Middle schools.

The teams will consist of faculty already at the schools. An administrator will serve on each one, as will a teacher at each grade level, a high school science teacher, media center specialist, and special education teacher.

Students may find tests a bit different, too. They will perform science experiments and be scored on their understanding of the processes involved.

The university wants to target minorities and women, Leonard said, as well as increase the number of students who go on to careers in science.

"Mathematics and science have traditionally been the bailiwick of boys," Leonard said, "and we now need to go and develop the under-represented groups.

"There are not as many people going into the areas of science and engineering today, so we need to direct more people into those fields."

Baugh Joins Staff

Robert Baugh of Greensboro has joined the Office of Institutional Advancement staff as Development Associate. His role will be to assist the Office of Development in the areas of direct mail, phonathon, annual giving, and donor stewardship.

Baugh is a 1993 graduate of North Carolina State University. While a student, Baugh served as the year-round Phonathon Chairman for the NCSU Annual Giving Office.

Carroll Receives Recognition

Dr. Dennis Carroll, director of teacher education and chairman of the education department at High Point University, has been selected to receive the 1993 Exemplary Teacher Award from the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry of the United Methodist Church in Nashville, Tenn.

The award is given to professors in United Methodist-related institutions whose accomplishments have made an extraordinary impact on their institutions and their students.

Carroll serves on the State Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Dr. Carroll was also honored at the university graduation exercises in May 1993 with the Meredith Clark Slane Distinguished Teacher-Service Award.

Carroll, an alumnus of High Point University, joined the faculty in 1988. Last October, the teacher education program was accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education, the nation's highest accreditation for teacher education in America.

Evening Degree Program

Graduates from the Evening Degree Program continue to be involved in various alumni projects and events. Volunteers serve refreshments during registration at both the High Point and Madison Park campuses and often become part of the registration staff.

Several alumni from the Evening Degree Program participated in the annual fall phonathon held to raise funds for evening school student scholarships. This was the second year that evening degree alumni conducted their own phonathon, and they were even more successful than last year.

The Evening Degree Program staff hosted their annual Christmas open house in early December.

This is always a festive occasion (even though it is before exams) and is an excellent opportunity for visiting among faculty, staff, and students. Some alumni stop by for the event to say "hello" to old friends.

Several Evening Degree Program graduates were among those in the fall who began in one of the University's graduate programs leading to the Master of Science in Management or the Master of Science in International Management.

The Evening Degree Program appreciates and welcomes the continuing alumni support. If time affords and interest motivates, your help, your ideas, and your suggestions are encouraged.

Graduate Studies Program

Programs for the Master of Science in Management and the Master of Science in International Management had an excellent beginning in Fall Semester 1993. Twenty-five students matriculated.

On October 26, 1993, President and Mrs. Jacob C. Martinson, Jr. hosted a reception for the graduate programs. Persons who attended the reception included graduate students, University administrators, the Graduate Faculty, and other guests. The reception was held in the Ed Pleasants Room in the Millis Center, High Point University.

From November 15-17, 1993, an accreditation committee visited the University. A Substantive Change Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools reviewed documents and interviewed University personnel regarding institutional effectiveness, financial resources, planning and evaluation processes, library/learning resources, and the graduate programs. The University is awaiting the written report of the committee.

Graduate enrollment continues to increase as the master's degree programs evolve. Twelve students have been offered admission to graduate studies for Spring Semester 1994.

Career Development News

Sam Leonard Beck has been named Director of Career Development at High Point University.

Sam received her undergraduate and graduate degrees from Wake Forest University and completed additional graduate courses at Wake Forest and UNC-G. She is a National Certified Counselor, National Certified Career Counselor, and North Carolina Licensed Professional Counselor.

Sam is eager to expand the role of Career Development services at High Point. "My background is in career counseling, and I feel that a well-developed program of career counseling is essential in assisting students to reach their full potential in the career arena. I want to insure that any student who needs assistance in making a career choice can receive this assistance in the Career Development Center. We have many resources which are used in this process. The student may take interest inventories and personality type indicators, undergo values clarification work, establish work-related preferences, generate career alternatives, research occupational possibilities, and utilize decision-making skills to make a choice. I work with the students in a counseling relationship as we go through this process."

The Career Development Center also continues to work with students after their career choice is made. "We conduct workshops and assist students in developing resumes so that they can best package their skills and accomplishments. We work with them on interviewing techniques and developing a sound job search strategy so they can begin networking and establishing their contacts -- a process which actually leads to most jobs." These steps are all extremely important for each student to learn.

To many students, Dr. Bonnie Truax is already a familiar face in the Career Development Center, having served as Interim Director in Spring 1993, and continuing on as Career Counselor since then. Bonnie works two evenings each week with Evening Degree Program students, devoting one evening to the main campus and one to the Madison Park campus. Bonnie is a career counseling and employment veteran, having worked over 14 years helping people make career decisions, find employment, and change their lives for the better. She is particularly interested in adult and working students who are earning a degree to better position themselves in their current job or to make a career move. Bonnie also has her own career consulting business in Greensboro and works with people who are in transitions.

High Point University is dedicated to helping students find viable employment. This semester, High Point has over 32 companies recruiting on campus. As a member of the North Carolina Career Consortium, the university co-sponsors a fall job fair and a nonprofit job fair in the spring, which are open to alumni of High Point University. Career Alumni Evening, held each February, is a chance for alumni of High Point University to come back to campus to share valuable career experience with students. Programs at the Center also include individual job counseling. Watch for exciting new program changes at the Career Development Center with its new energy and leadership.

Men's Cross Country

The men's cross country team qualified for the NAIA National Meet for the second consecutive year, winning the District 26 meet by a wide margin. The Panthers finished 27th out of a field of 40 teams. Junior James White earned All-American honors and was also voted the Runner of the Year in NAIA District 26. Juniors Mike Dyess and Sean Carter and sophomore Mike White earned NAIA All-District 26 honors while Bob Davidson was voted NAIA District 26 Coach of the Year.

Women's Cross Country

The women's cross country team qualified for the NAIA National Meet for the first time, finishing 33rd out of a field of 40 teams. While winning the NAIA District 26 team title by a comfortable margin, senior Delia Stanley, sophomores Roz Hall and Elizabeth Young and freshman Melissa Lansberg each won NAIA All-District 26 honors. Bob Davidson was voted NAIA District 26 Coach of the Year.

Volleyball

The Lady Panthers completed a 15-13 season, losing in the Carolinas Conference championship match in five games to nationally ranked St. Andrews College. Senior Shelly Whitaker was selected to the NAIA All-District 26 and All-Carolinas Conference teams while senior Gina Sink and sophomore Anitra Dodson won All-Conference honors.

Women's Soccer

High Point posted a 12-5-1 record in only the second year of competition, rebounding from a dismal 2-14-1 first-year record. The Lady Panthers lost to nationally ranked Lees-McRae College in the semi-finals of the Carolinas Conference tournament. Senior Paula Shelton was named first team All-South while junior Jonelle Corsey was voted second team All-South. Junior Amy Gonyeau earned NAIA All-District 26 and All-Carolinas Conference honors while sophomore Kristy Powell and freshman Deb Nichols were named to the All-Conference team. Shelton was also selected to participate on the East team in the first NAIA Women's Senior Bowl game.

Men's Soccer

High Point posted its first losing record since 1978, compiling a 5-9-3 mark. The Panthers played in eight overtime contests during the year, losing in the first round of the Carolinas Conference tournament to Coker College in sudden death overtime. Sophomore goalkeeper Dwayne Adams was voted second team NAIA All-American while junior Dean Preston was an NAIA All-District 26 and All-Carolinas Conference selection. Junior Dave Sullenberger, with a 3.95 GPA, was named to the NAIA Scholar-Athlete team.

Qubein Chairs National Committee

Nido Qubein answers to many descriptives: management consultant, motivational speaker, author, and businessperson just to begin the list. High Point University officials are happy that he has agreed to add another designation: Chairman of the National Alumni Development Committee.

Since graduating from High Point in 1970, Qubein has blazed a trail of success in the world of business as well as in the community of High Point. University officials are confident that his energy and talents will bear fruit as he enlists the support of High Point's 11,000 alumni across the United States.

Dr. Jacob C. Martinson, president of High Point University, calls Qubein "a perfect choice" for the assignment.

"Nido Qubein has a reputation for excellence in everything he does," said Martinson. "As a businessman, a family man, and community leader, his qualifications are impeccable. He has proven his dedication and commitment to the university time and again."

Alumni representatives on this committee will be drawn from California, Connecticut, the District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia.

Qubein addresses more than 200 business, industrial and professional groups worldwide each year. He is one of nine recipients of "The Cavett," considered the Oscar of the speaking profession.

In 1986, he was inducted into the International Speakers Hall of Fame.

He has also made his mark as an author, writing over 30 books on sales, personal development and communication. His books and cassette learning systems are used by hundreds of organizations in the United States and 30 foreign countries. Qubein is married to '77 alumna Mariana Hakim Qubein.

Since 1980, Qubein has served as chairman of Creative Services Inc. of High Point, an international consulting firm specializing in employee development. A sampling of clients includes AT&T, Prudential Insurance, Wrangler and General Electric.

He is a director of the Southern National Corporation, a bank holding company based in Winston-Salem; director of American Humanics Foundation in Kansas City, Mo., and director of the American Task Force for Lebanon, based in Washington, D.C..

He is a trustee of the North Carolina Shakespeare Festival. In the High Point area, he is chairman of the

Metropolitan YMCA, trustee of High Point Regional Hospital, secretary of High Point Partners and director of the Economic Development Corporation.

Over the years, Qubein has remained loyal to his High Point roots. He was named the university's Alumnus of the Year in 1988, he has served on the school's Board of Visitors, and established the Nido Qubein Associates Scholarship Fund, which has provided scholarships to more than 300 students at North Carolina private colleges, including many at High Point University. More than 100 North Carolina business executives also contribute to the fund.

"That gives me great joy," said Qubein. "I really have a passion for these scholarships. I need to help other people because so many people have helped me."

Qubein believes that giving of one's time and resources to causes that uplift humanity is good for the soul as well as for business.

"You don't help others so that others will help you in return," he said. "You do it because it's your obligation as a member of humanity. If you give from the heart, others will give from their hearts in return, and you become a sharer in human generosity."

Qubein sees alumni giving to High Point University as part of that master plan for humanity.

"High Point University has a way of encouraging individuals to develop and utilize their personal attitudes for positive, productive results," said Qubein.

PHONATHON GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

The following is a brief synopsis of the 1993-94 phonathon giving opportunities.

Fine Arts Center

A new domed fine arts building will be constructed on front campus near the original site of Montlieu Avenue. The building will house classrooms, seminar and workshop areas, instrumental practice areas, a performance center, an art gallery and special collections room, and faculty offices.

General Scholarship Funds

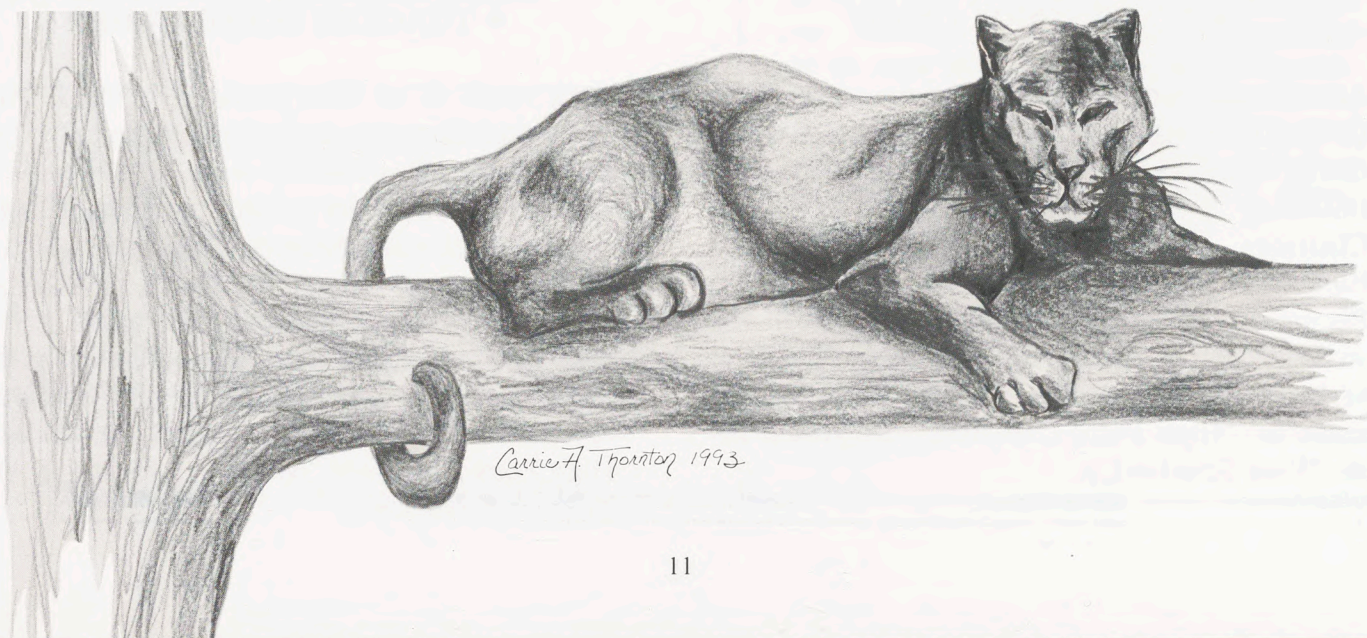
The General Scholarship Fund was established in the fall of 1986 with the gifts from High Point University Alumni.

The purpose of this fund is to provide a minimum of \$10,000 per academic year in scholarship monies for distribution at the discretion of the Office of Financial Aid. The scholarships are awarded on the basis of financial need, as determined from analysis of the applicants' FAF or FFS forms. The funds are awarded on a first come, first served basis, with as many awards as possible being made. There are no limitations to field of study or place of residence.

Beginning with each fiscal year, all contributions made to the General Scholarship Fund are placed in the endowed fund account. The principal sum of the endowed account is invested at the discretion of university representatives having responsibility for investing the university's endowed funds. At the end of the fiscal year, the investment's income from the principal is placed into a restricted account accompanied by a portion of the principal to equal \$10,000 in award monies. This pattern is followed each year until the interest generated from the investment of the principal totals \$10,000 or more annually.

Named Scholarship Funds

There are over 150 different scholarships available at High Point University, many not yet at the \$10,000 endowment level. If you have any questions or need any information concerning these scholarships, our student representatives will be prepared to answer these questions for you.





IN MEMORY OF

• CHARLES EMERSON HAYWORTH, JR.

The High Point University community mourns the loss of Charles Emerson Hayworth, Jr., Chairman Emeritus of the Board of Trustees.

Hayworth, who died January 2 after a period of declining health, was instrumental in the growth and development of High Point University. He served as the school's Chairman of the Board from 1978 to 1985 and was a major contributor to the university. He provided the funding for the Chas. E. Hayworth Sr. Memorial Chapel in memory of his father and is the principal donor for the university's proposed fine arts center. Hayworth received an honorary doctor of laws degree from the university in 1986.

"There wouldn't be a High Point University as we know it today if there hadn't been strong leadership at the time he was chairman," said High Point University President Jacob C. Martinson. "He was incisive and very keen-minded as an administrator. Combine that with his love for this school, and you just couldn't fully explain his significance to the university."

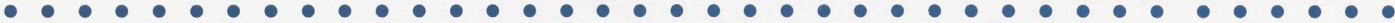

Dear Alumni and Friends of the University:



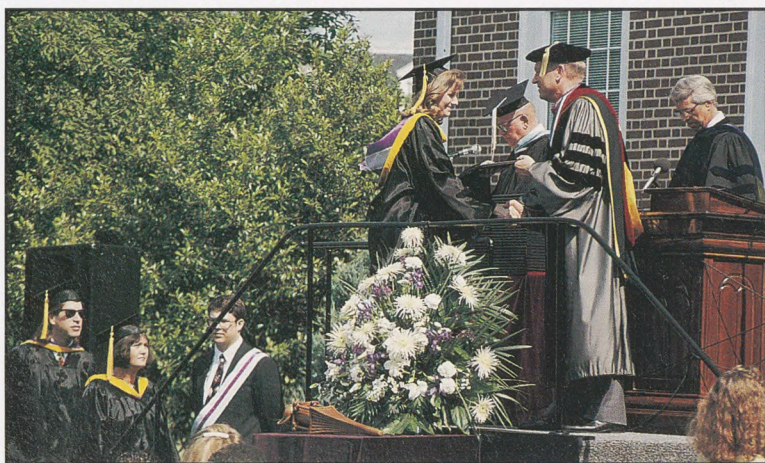
University of Notre Dame President Edward A. Malloy told graduating members of High Point University's Class of 1994 that anything is possible.

"You have toughed it out, you have fought the good fight," said Malloy. "You have what it takes. The challenges that lie ahead are all attainable."

Malloy delivered the commencement address to 497 graduates and over 2,500 family members and friends gathered on a bright Saturday morning to witness the annual rite of passage on the front lawn of Roberts Hall.

Malloy urged the graduates to continue to lead lives of self-examination. "What has begun here needs to continue for a lifetime," said Malloy. "We shouldn't settle for simple answers to complex questions."

Father Malloy is in his second five-year term as the 16th president at Notre Dame. He recently concluded a term as chair of the American Council on Education, the umbrella organization for American higher education. Father Malloy formerly was a member of President George Bush's Advisory Council on Drugs and now is a member of the Commission on Substance Abuse at Colleges and Universities, an arm of the Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University. He is a founding director of the Points of Light Foundation, a national initiative to promote community service.

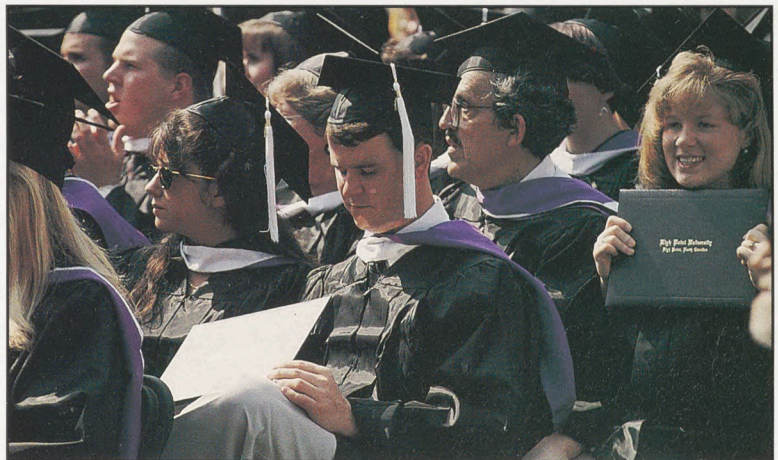

Martinson Named Honorary Fellow

High Point University President, Dr. Jacob C. Martinson, has been named an honorary fellow at Westminster College, Oxford, England. Martinson is the first American ever to receive this distinguished honor from Westminster.

Trustee, James Millis, Sr. accompanied Martinson on a trip to England about four years ago when High Point College first explored the possibility of a partnership with Westminster. He said the award is indicative of the calibre of the President's character and is "most deserved."

Martinson received the honor and presented a response on behalf of the honorary fellows during a March ceremony in Oxford. A fellow in British higher education becomes an esteemed member of the college community. It is one of the highest honors a British university can give.

While the famed John Wesley graduated from Oxford University, Westminster College is the only Methodist degree granting institution in

England. Martinson joins an elite group of honorary fellows at Westminster that includes Dr. Donald English, chairman of the World Methodist Council, Bishop Stanley Mogoba, presiding bishop of the Methodist Church of South Africa, and Baroness Mary Warnock of Girton College, Cambridge.

Martinson, a United Methodist minister who has served on the board of directors of the National Association of Colleges and Schools of the United Methodist Church, was recognized for his achievements during his tenure at High Point University. Under the guidance of Martinson, High Point has gained university status, experienced a 70 percent increase in enrollment, and enjoyed dramatic increases in both the endowment and alumni giving. In addition to his duties at High Point University, Martinson has served as chairman of the High Point Chamber of Commerce, chairman of the High Point Board of the First Union National Bank, chairman of the Piedmont Independent College Association, and president of the Carolinas Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Linker Receives Recognition

Dr. Susan M. Linker, associate professor of Spanish at High Point University, was presented the Meredith Clark Slane Distinguished Teaching-Service Award during commencement exercises at High Point University.

The Slane Award recognizes outstanding classroom performance, interest in students as expressed through academic advising and sponsorship of student organizations, participation in campus and community activities, and professional growth.



The award is presented annually at commencement in honor of the late Meredith Clark Slane of High Point, a longtime benefactress of High Point University. Recipients receive a plaque and a \$1,000 stipend.

Linker joined the faculty in 1989. In addition to teaching all levels of Spanish, she teaches English as a second language to foreign students at High Point University. For the past three years, she has served as Foreign Student Advisor, an extremely demanding position because of the special needs and difficulties of this particular student population.

Alpha Chi Builds for the Future

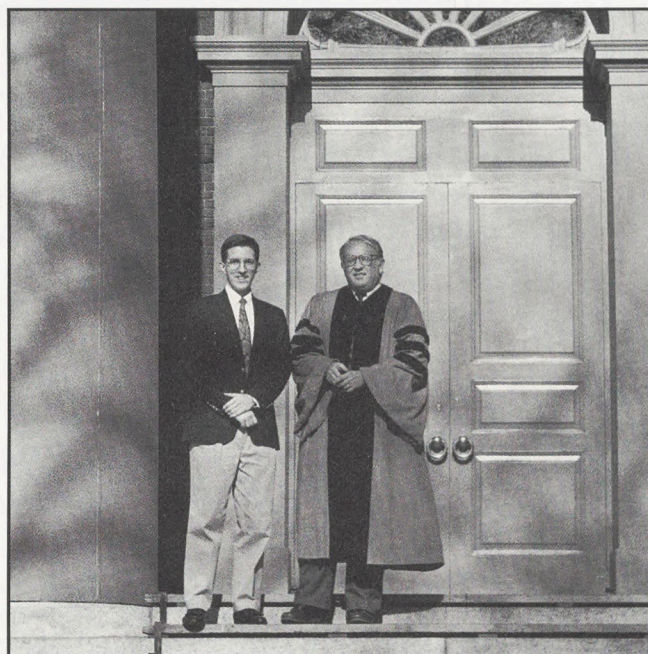

Reverend Ralph Eanes, the guest speaker, addressed the approximately 350 people in attendance. He shared his perspective of what it was like to be the spouse of an Evening Degree student. The Sporting Life

High Point University won the Joby Hawn Cup, given each year to the Carolinas Conference school with the best overall athletic program that year. High Point has won the award ten times since its inception in 1975.

Messick Sportsmanship Award

High Point won the Messick Sportsmanship Award for the third time in four years. This award has been given since 1984 and is based on voting by all coaches and athletic directors in the conference.

Men's Basketball

High Point posted its best record since 1988-89 as they went 21-8 on the year, finishing second during the regular season and losing to Pfeiffer College in the conference championship game in the tournament. The Panthers began the year 10-0 and were ranked as high as 12th in the NAIA national poll during the year. Junior forward Robert Martin was named to the All-Carolinas Conference team while junior guard Danny Watson was selection as the team's MVP.

Women's Basketball

The Lady Panthers had an 11-16 record for the year, recovering from a disastrous 1-9 start. High Point finished tied for fourth during the regular season and lost in the conference tournament semi-finals to Mt. Olive College. Senior forward Tonya Murrell was named as the team's MVP.

Baseball

High Point tumbled to an 11-30 record, finishing sixth during regular season Carolinas Conference play. The Panthers won one and lost two in the conference double elimination tournament. Senior catcher Darren White was selected to the All-Carolinas Conference team and was named as the team's MVP.

Men's Tennis

High Point was 12-3 on the season but finished a disappointing fifth in the Carolinas Conference tournament. Senior Vesa Kempainen and sophomore Donald Marriott were named to the All-Carolinas Conference team.

Women's Tennis

The Lady Panthers posted a 6-10 mark this year, finishing fourth in the Carolinas conference tournament. Sophomores Heather Haberfield, Asa Johansson, and Julie Fair were named to the All-Carolinas Conference team.

Golf

The Panthers finished second in the Carolinas Conference tournament but received an at-large bid to the NAIA National tournament. Junior Donnie Franks was the conference medalist while junior Grant Thomson was also named to the All-Carolinas Conference team. High Point finished 8th overall in the NAIA Nationals conducted in Tulsa, OK. Thomson finished 3rd individually and was named to the NAIA All-American Team. In addition, Thomson was named to the NAIA All-American Academic Team, the only golfer in the country to be named to both teams.

Track

While track is no longer a conference sport, the Panthers had another outstanding year. Senior Tracey Henry qualified for the NAIA National Meet in two events, the 400 meter hurdles as well as the triple-jump. Henry qualified as All-American in both triple-jump and 400 meter hurdles.

Tubby Smith: From High Point to Tulsa

Trying to become a part of March Madness was maddening and reaching the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Basketball Tournament was certainly sweet for University of Tulsa basketball coach and High Point University alumnus Orlando "Tubby" Smith last March. But to reach the round of 16 for the first time in the school's history required more than outscoring a pair of college basketball heavyweights, UCLA and Oklahoma State, in the tournament's first two rounds.

No, Tulsa's road to the Final Four, which was detoured this year by eventual national champion Arkansas in the Midwest Regional semifinals, did not begin in Oklahoma City, or any other NCAA Tournament site or Missouri Valley Conference city. Instead, it began in Scotland, Maryland. Before there was a Sweet Sixteen in Tubby Smith's life, there had to be a Sensational Seventeen.

"We preach overachieving to our players at Tulsa," said Smith. "That's the way my life has been. I'm from a family of 17 children. My father had high expectations of us. That has stuck with me over the years. While I was growing up in the '60's, I didn't have anybody to identify with who was a professional athlete. Professional sports did not have the impact back then that it has today. My role model was my father. He had a strong work ethic."

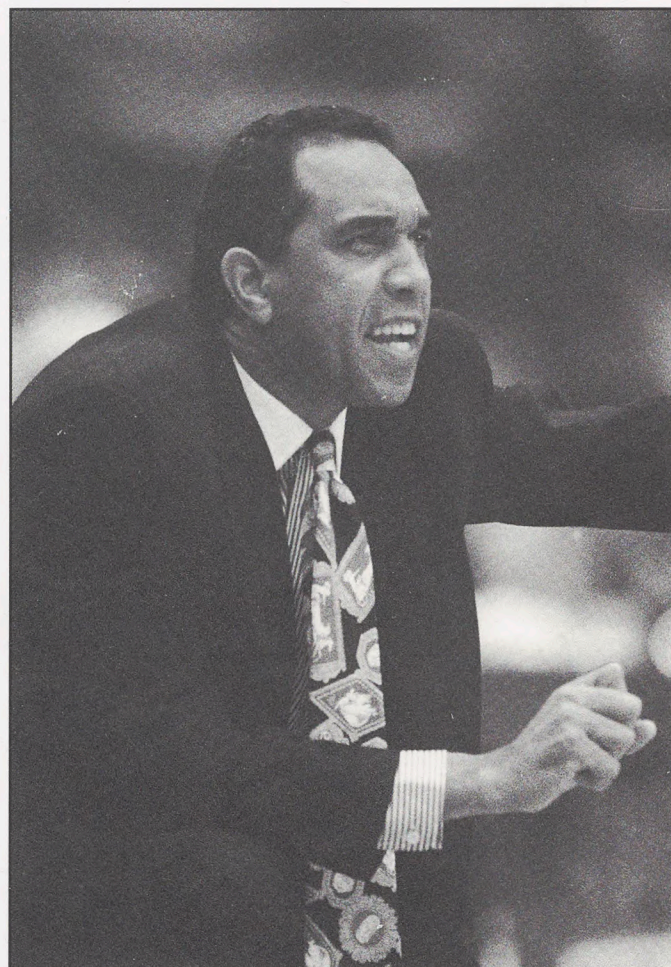
Smith did not stop learning after he left home. He found more role models waiting on him when he arrived at High Point College on a basketball scholarship in 1969. In four years at High Point, he played for three head coaches: Bob Vaughn, who recruited him after Lefty Driesell told him he wasn't good enough to play at Maryland; J.D. Barnett; and current Panthers coach and NAIA Hall of Fame member Jerry Steele. Smith credits Barnett and Steele with having the greatest influence on his coaching career.

From Barnett, Smith learned the fundamentals of the game and was later given his first college coaching opportunity. Barnett, who moved on to coach at Virginia Commonwealth, offered Smith a job as an assistant coach in 1979 and Smith accepted.

But Steele holds a special place in Smith's heart. "He has been my mentor," Smith said. "He has such a great

sense of humor, yet because of the fact that he's done just about everything in basketball, playing for Wake Forest and coaching professional basketball, you know that he knows what he is talking about. The way he handled himself made you want to work hard for him. His philosophy about life was close to mine."

After attracting attention as an honorable mention high school All-American player out of Great Mills High School, Smith enjoyed a successful collegiate career at High Point, averaging 15 points and five rebounds a game as a four-year starter. He was off to a great start during his senior season and entertained hopes of being drafted by a professional team before breaking a bone in his shooting hand. He was not drafted, so he had to turn in a different direction.

"I had to start reevaluating my goals after I wasn't drafted," said Smith. "I almost went into the Air Force. But I know how much I loved the game of basketball. So I said to myself, 'Hey, if I can't play, let's coach.' Coach Steele saw that I had some potential to be a coach. He helped me get a high school coaching job in North Carolina after I coached for a while at my old high school."

Smith insists he could have been happy coaching at the high school level today. "I never dreamed of coaching at this (Division I) level," said Smith. "I was just trying to be the best coach I could be at the time." Steele saw something special in Smith, however. "I knew that, with the way he got along with people and the type of person he was, he would be successful no matter what he went into," Steele said.

Smith believes his collegiate years at High Point were critical in his development as an adult. "I can't place enough value on my experience at High Point," he said. "After my experience there, I understand all walks of life a lot better, and I am able to see different points of view."

Following six years of high school coaching, Smith served as an assistant for 12 years at Virginia Commonwealth, South Carolina, and Kentucky before being named head coach at Tulsa in 1991, succeeding, ironically enough, Barnett.

He posted back-to-back winning records in his first two seasons at Tulsa, then saw his team capture the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title this past season. But the Golden Hurricane lost in the semifinals of the conference tournament and could not claim the conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament. Thus began an excruciating week-long wait for Smith and his team to see if they would be invited to the tournament.

"All week long the anticipation built up," said Smith. "There was a lot of speculation in the media on whether or not we were good enough to make it or not. Then you get to the point that the day comes and you're even more anxious. I thought we would get in because I thought we had one of the better teams in the country. So we

brought a television into our locker room to watch the selection show with our "family" -- the coaching staff, players, and our immediate family members. I was sitting there with my wife, watching all the pairings appear on the screen. By the time our name appeared on the screen, I was on my knees. We were the 61st team to appear on the screen, so by the time our name came up, everybody in the room just exploded with emotion. It's a feeling I'll never forget. It was like when I was expecting my first child and he finally popped out."

But the excitement didn't end at Tulsa when they were selected for the tournament. It was just beginning. Against UCLA, which was ranked No.1 at one point during the season, the Golden Hurricane raced out to a 46-17 first-half lead and coasted to a 112-102 first-round upset of the Bruins.

"The way we took control of the game so early was unbelievable," said Smith. "But playing UCLA in the first round was the best thing that could have happened to us. The UCLA kids had been asking where Tulsa was in the paper all week, and that gave our kids even more incentive. They were really fired up."

Even after losing to Arkansas, the excitement and momentum of the program on the rise continues to build, according to Smith. "We were trying to recruit a kid named Jamie Gillin from California, who was a top 10 prospect in the country who was still unsigned. Before the tournament, we called him up and tried to tell him how interested we were in having him come to Tulsa. He wasn't sure what he was going to do at that point. But after the tournament, all of a sudden this kid calls us up and says he's ready to come."

Other people have been calling Smith as well. "I've been recruited by a couple of other schools concerning coaching jobs since the season ended," Smith said. "But I chose to stay at Tulsa. It reminds me a lot of High Point. There's the same feeling of family here. And I have my best team ever returning for next year."

Smith is in no hurry to leave his basketball "family" and move up the professional ladder. "If you have to apply for a job in this business, you're not going to get it," Smith said. "If you do your job, they'll come get you."
