## High Point Welcomes Class of 1997

High Point University officials had a problem to solve when the 1993 freshman class arrived on campus for orientation. A pleasant problem, that is.


They had to figure out how to accommodate the second largest freshman class in the history of the institution. Last year, the university enrolled 335 freshmen and planned for a seven percent increase this fall. Instead, freshman enrollment jumped 15 percent to 385 when the 1993 fall term began.

"Every single spot there is a bed is being utilized," said Gart Evans, dean of students. To be exact, that means 856 beds have been filled.

To accommodate the additional freshmen, the university added eight to ten orientation counselors, three new staff members, two additional faculty members, and eight new course sections. And more adjustments could be forthcoming because of the increased attention High Point University is receiving, according to Jim Schlimmer, dean of admissions.



"We have had a 40 percent increase in student inquiries from last year," he said. "That's almost an unmanageable number. It appears that the reputation of High Point University is being well received."

The academic profile of the university also continued to rise with an increase of Presidential Scholars/Fellows from 58 a year ago to 74 this fall. "Obviously, we are excited about that number and the talents these people will bring to our freshman class," said Schlimmer.

Schlimmer credited the increases to a number of factors, including nearly \$2 million available for scholarships and financial aid, a 30 percent increase from a year ago.

and behavioral sciences professor Pat Haun, on the weekend of August 21-22. After checking into their rooms and going through academic testing procedures on Saturday, the freshmen attended an orientation overview and a reception hosted by President Jacob C. Martinson in the Millis Center. Later in the evening, students, parents, faculty,

and staff were treated to a campus picnic on the front lawn of Roberts Hall.

Following a campus worship service and lunch on Sunday, the freshmen participated in the "Land Olympics," a series of team sports events such as the tug-of-war, at the Crowder Intramural Field.

Freshmen also received individual academic advising from the university faculty before starting classes on August 25.

#### Carroll Elected to Council

Dr. Dennis Carroll, director of teacher education and chairman of the education department at High Point University, has been elected to the Southern Regional Council as a representative of the College Board Southern Regional Assembly Academic Division.

One of the most important functions of the Board is to provide a forum for the consideration of issues and concerns affecting students' access to higher education.

Carroll, an alumnus of High Point University, joined the faculty in 1988. Last October, the teacher education program was accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education. Carroll is active in all phases of education, serving on the State Committee of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, committees of the state and local schools, and many other educational committees.

Carroll also received the 1993 Meredith Clark Slane Distinguished Teaching-Service Award at High Point University, which recognizes outstanding classroom performance, interest in students as expressed through academic advising and sponsorship of student organizations, participation in campus and community activities, and professional growth.

## Night Owls



#### Evening Degree Program

The Evening Degree Program began the 1993-94 academic year with an enrollment of approximately 1,000 students. The evening school's New Student Orientation was held on August 18 in the Campus Center in High Point. Approximately 250 attended, including guests. Tom Ingram, a 1993 Madison Park graduate, and Michelle Westberg from the High Point Campus spoke of their experiences in returning to the classroom as adults, offered tips, and answered questions from the prospective students. Dr. Charles Warde, Associate Professor of Chemistry and a frequent teacher in the evening program, shared some thoughts and gave words of encouragement.

A new wing for the Madison Park campus in Winston-Salem was completed in July. The expansion includes seven classrooms and a break room. Of special note is an amphitheater, seating 48, and an art education room with specialized lighting.

Beginning this fall, Dr. Bonnie Truax of the University's Career Development Center will be available to assist Evening Degree Program students and graduate students on Monday and Thursday nights, devoting one evening to each campus.

Last year the Evening Degree Program began a chapter of Alpha Sigma Lambda, a national honor society for adult students. ASL is a non-profit organization devoted to the advancement of scholarship and to the recognition of superior academic achievement and leadership of students in continuing higher education programs. The High Point University charter chapter, Theta Theta, is now one of 184 chapters nationwide. Forty-six students were inducted in Theta Theta's first year.

Elementary education was added as a major in the evening in 1989. The first students to complete the major were graduated during the May 1993 commencement exercises and all have received teaching appointments.

A new scholarship for evening students was recently established by the Triad Women's Forum. A Guilford County organization, the Forum seeks to support women professionals by sharing career information, experiences, and ideas, and to help educate and encourage women to achieve their career goals. The Forum will donate annually to the scholarship which will be awarded each year to the chosen recipients.

#### Graduate Studies Program

Programs leading to the Master of Science in Management and the Master of Science in International Management were implemented with the start of the 1993-94 academic year. These programs are offered through the Earl N. Phillips School of Business.

Twenty-five students are enrolled in the University's first class of graduate students. This group has an average age of 31 years and is balanced almost equally between females and males.

There are eight persons who are members of the graduate teaching faculty. In the area of business, graduate instruction is provided by Dr. James M. Adams, Dr. W. Troy Anders, Dr. George Coggins, Jr., Dr. Gerald Fox, Dr. Michael J. McCully, and Dr. Marlon L. Winters. Courses in intercultural perspectives and ethics are taught by Dr. Carole A. Head and Dr. Harold L. Warlick, Jr., respectively. No faculty member has exclusive teaching responsibilities in the Graduate Program.

A Substantive Change Committee of the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools is scheduled to visit High Point University on November 15-17, 1993. The task of this committee will be to evaluate the extent of the University's compliance with the <u>Criteria for Accreditation</u> for offering master's degree programs.


#### THE MILLIS CENTER:

Pride. To be proud of yourself you must feel good. To feel good about yourself you must look good. Last year, High Point students seemed to lack a sense of pride and athletic spirit. Our Alumni Gymnasium, which first opened its doors in 1957, had seen better days, much better days.

It is now 1993, and pride has taken on an entirely new meaning at High Point University. The administration is excited, the faculty is excited, but more importantly the students are excited. What has caused this positive turnabout? The construction of the James H. & Jesse E. Millis Athletic/Convocation Center, or the Millis Center for short, is the reason behind the university's new-found sense of pride.



After months of campaigning and fund raising, construction on the Millis Center began in the fall of 1991. A year's time passed as the High Point campus and community watched skilled hands and new equipment transform the Alumni Gym.

- Three racquetball/handball courts
- New locker rooms which are more accommodating for the home and visiting sports teams
- · A visiting dignitaries box which offers a full view of the arena
- The Ed Pleasants Room which is used for meetings of the Panther Club


The convocation and athletic center is truly breathtaking.

It is a facility of which the university can be and is proud.

The first person who had the opportunity to appear in the new complex was conservative political columnist William F. Buckley. He christened the building on October 7 when he spoke to a supportive audience. Following Buckley's visit was nationally known recording artist Louise Mandrell, who performed in concert on October 28 for the High Point campus and community. Since that time, the arena floor has been used as the "battleground" for the volleyball and basketball teams of High Point. Attendance at these games is up, enthusiasm is greater, and pride has returned to High Point University.

Speaking as a student, I can reassure each person that it is a joy to swim laps in a pool at the end of the day to unwind from an afternoon spent sitting in cramped desks listening to lectures. ## The Graduate Program

Fulfilling one of its goals as an emerging university, High Point University will launch its graduate studies program in August.

Two degree programs will be initially offered: the Master of Science in Management and the Master of Science in International Management. All courses will be taught at the High Point campus in the evening.

University officials began accepting applications for admission to the graduate program in January after receiving permission to offer the program from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. High Point University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award bachelor's degrees and is a candidate for accreditation to award the master's degree.

"By offering an evening program, it makes it possible for the working professional to matriculate," said Dr. Alberta Haynes Herron, Director of the Graduate Studies program at High Point University. "The evening nature of the program and the management aspect of it are of great interest to area business and industry. The knowledge and skills acquired through this program will be very attractive to them."

"There are many MBA programs offered in our area," added Herron. "But the prospective students we talked to did not want an MBA degree. We sensed there was a need out there for another graduate degree other than the MBA."

The Master of Science programs in Management and in International Management are designed to teach students to:

- think abstractly and with imagination about corporate organizations and their goals and objectives;
- understand and interpret corporate environments;
- act based on information and analysis;
- recognize and take into account the ethical implications of business decisions.

#### **VOLLEYBALL**

#### **MEN'S CROSS-COUNTRY**

High Point had another banner year, winning the Carolinas Conference and NAIA District 26 titles for the third time in four years, and advancing to the NAIA National Meet where they placed 30th. James White, Sean Carter, Mike Dyess, Kevin Hampson and Jeff Goddard were each on the All-Carolinas Conference team while White, Carter and Dyess were named to the All-NAIA District 26 team. White and Coach Bob Davidson were named Runner of the Year and Coach of the Year, respectively, in both the Carolinas Conference and NAIA District 26. White was also voted team MVP.

#### WOMEN'S CROSS-COUNTRY

High Point placed second in the Carolinas Conference and fifth in District 26 as Elizabeth Young was selected to the All-Carolinas Conference team and was voted team MVP.

#### MEN'S SOCCER

The Panthers posted a 6-0-0 conference record during the regular season, going undefeated for the second consecutive year in Carolinas Conference play. High Point was 13-6-1 overall, losing to Belmont Abbey in both the conference and district finals. High Point had regular season wins over Belmont Abbey and Catawba, both ranked in the top ten nationally.

Freshman goalkeeper Dwayne Adams, a national team player from Bermuda, was a third team All-America selection even though he only played in fourteen matches due to playing in World Cup qualifying games. Senior Mike Hatfield was named to the All-Conference and All-District teams as well as being voted the team's MVP. Sophomore Dean Preston was an All-Conference player. Coach Woody Gibson was voted Carolinas Conference Coach of the Year, the fifth time in fifteen years he has won that honor.

## Alumni Scholarship Program

Often the quality education offered at High Point University is available only because of the existence of a strong scholarship program. During the 1992-93 academic year approximately 140 scholarships were awarded to deserving students. Alumni play a key role in this program by supporting the alumni scholarships. Representatives from the Alumni Association review applications annually and make awards based on the established criteria. There are currently seven alumni scholarships.

- Alumni Memorial Scholarship, established in 1969 from receipt of memorial gifts. Awarded annually to students who demonstrate good Christian character, promise of high future potential, good scholastic standing and a need for financial assistance.
- Clifford Hinshaw Scholarship, established in 1979 in honor of Dr. Hinshaw, a professor of education at High Point for many years. He also served in a number of other positions at the University, including Dean of Instruction and Director of the Summer School. He organized the evening school in 1960 and served as its director until his death in 1967. This scholarship is awarded to deserving students in good academic standing.
- E. Vera Idol Scholarship, established in 1977 in honor of Dr. Idol, an English professor at High Point from its founding in 1924 until her retirement in 1958. It is awarded to students with first preference to be given to a student with a chosen major in English. The recipients are upperclassmen having a minimum GPA of 2.0.

- P.E. Lindley Scholarship, established in 1967 to remember Dr. Lindley who was a beloved teacher and Dean of the University at its founding. The P.E. Lindley Scholarship is awarded to students of Christian character, good scholastic standing, showing promise of high future potential and in need of financial assistance.
- Louise Adams Scholarship, established in 1963 by the graduating class to honor Miss Adams, a longtime member of the University community. She is a 1929 graduate and was a member of the faculty for many years and then a part of the administrative staff until her retirement. She continues to take an active role in the life of the University. It is awarded to a student who shows potential for outstanding scholarship.
- High Point Day Scholarship, established in 1976 for the purpose of assisting a commuting student attending High Point University. It is awarded to academically able students who demonstrate good character, high future potential and a need for financial assistance.



Dear Friends of the University:

The end of an academic year is always a time to reflect upon the accomplishments of the past twelve months, but it also provides the opportunity to focus upon the year ahead. High Point University continues to excel, and many individuals within the University community have been recognized for their outstanding contributions to academic and community life. To mention a few persons is dangerous because other people with equal or greater accomplishments are often overlooked, and to all those we express our apologies.

Many developments in programs and facilities have been taking place. The campus is still getting adjusted to the presence of the beautifully renovated and expanded Millis Athletic/Convocation Center. The \$7 million facility officially opened in October and has been the site of numerous noteworthy events including a lecture by William F. 
#### Graduation 1993


Qubein, who is chief executive officer of High Point's Creative Services, Inc., an international consulting firm, and a partner in Northpointe Investment





Dr. Dennis Carroll receives Distinguished Teaching Service Award.







### YWCA Gives Top Award to Bill Beil

Bill Beil, director of computer services at High Point University, received the Friend of the YWCA Award, the organization's top award, given annually to a person who has made outstanding contributions to the YWCA.

Since January 1990, Beil has helped the YWCA install and maintain an efficient computer system. His work has included installing four computers and transferring software and data; installing software as it was purchased; instructing staff and providing technical assistance as needed; installing a database of registered women voters and creating a program to help staff members access and sort these records; working with the post office to get carrier route numbers onto the YWCA's database records; giving a large savings in bulkmailing postage expense; responding to emergency questions and repair calls; and helping to print labels for bulk mailings.

### High Point U. Hosts Golf Tourney

High Point University recently delved into uncharted fundraising territory.

The school combined with Otterbein College in Westerville, Ohio to host a two-day golf tournament in May for both schools' alumni, trustees, and friends.

"Oh, we're out here to win," says John Lefler, Vice President for Institutional Advancement at High Point University. "But it's also a fine way to cultivate and to keep some of the alumni closer to each school."

Sixty-eight golfers from the two schools played in the tournament at Oak Hollow and Jamestown golf courses. High Point University won the inaugural event.

Officials say that this is the only event of its kind in the nation.

Next year, High Point golfers will travel to Otterbein and play the tournament there.

### McBrayer Earns Certification

Phil McBrayer, Assistant Professor of Management and Accounting, achieved the Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) designation based on results from the November, 1992, CIA Exam. In so doing, he earned a Certificate of Excellence awarded to the top six candidates passing all four parts of the exam in one sitting.

Phil first became a part of High Point University as an adjunct instructor in 1980, later joining as a full-time faculty member in 1988. Phil also hold professional designations as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and a Certified Management Accountant (CMA).

### Warde Named Fiction Finalist

Caitlin M. Warde, a sophomore English major from Greensboro, was named a finalist in the fiction category at the Hollins (Va.) College Thirty-Third Annual Literary Festival.

Warde's entry was titled, "Late Waiting for Susan." Warde joined finalists from Bethel, Hollins, and Randolph-Macon Colleges and Vanderbilt University.

# The Sporting Life



### WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The Panthers posted a 16-13 record overall with a 10-4 mark, good for second place, in the Carolinas Conference. High Point lost in the semi-finals of the conference tournament to Mt. Olive.

Seniors Arlene King, Heather Moore and Charlotte Totulis garnered many honors for the Panthers. King was named to the All-Conference and All-NAIA District 26 team for the third consecutive year while Moore was named to the NAIA Academic All-American team. Totulis was voted the Most Valuable Player by team members.

King also finished sixth on the all time Panther scoring list with 1,432 points and fifth on the all time rebounding list with 710. Moore was second on the all time assists list with 448 in her career.

### MEN'S BASKETBALL

High Point finished the season with a 12-15 overall record and were tied for second in the conference regular season race with a 9-5 mark. The Panthers lost to Barton in the opening round of the Carolinas Conference tournament but advanced to the NAIA District 26 playoffs for the second consecutive year. High Point lost in the first round of the districts to Lenoir-Rhyne, a team which eventually lost in the national quarter-finals.

Michael Skinner, a junior forward, was named to the All-Carolinas Conference and All-NAIA District 26 teams as well as being voted the team's Most Valuable Player.

### **WOMEN'S TENNIS**

The Panthers finished the year with a 9-9 overall record, 3-3 in the conference regular season. High Point was third in the conference tournament and sixth in the NAIA District tournament.

Paivi Tapaninen, a senior, was All-District 26 as well as being named the team's Most Valuable Player.

### MEN'S TENNIS

High Point was 4-7 during the rain-plagued season, finishing fourth in the Carolinas Conference tournament and ninth in the NAIA District 26 tournament.

Junior Vesa Kemppainen and senior Chris Forst were both named to the All-Carolinas Conference team.

### GOLF

The golf team participated in nine tournaments during the season, finishing in the top half of the field in each one during the regular season. The conference tournament saw the Panthers fall to sixth in the league and ninth in the District 26 tournament. Sophomore Allen McGee was voted the team's MVP

### BASEBALL

High Point posted a 20-23 mark on the season, finishing fifth in the Carolinas Conference regular season with a 7-11 record. Senior Kirk Gurley was voted to the All-Carolinas Conference team.

### TRACK

Senior Brian Payne and junior Tracey Henry led the Panthers to their best finish ever at the NAIA National Outdoor Track Meet. High Point finished 11th overall with those two participants.


Payne completed his brilliant intercollegiate career with two national championships and a near miss in a third. In March Payne had won the 55-meter high hurdles at the National Indoor Meet for his first championship. He then collected first place in the 110-meter high hurdles at the National Outdoor Meet and finished a close second in the 400-meter Intermediate Hurdles. These championships, along with his 1990 national title in the 110-meter hurdles, make him one of the most decorated athletes in University history.

Henry made the All-American team for the second year in a row, finishing fifth in the 400-meter Intermediate Hurdles and sixth in the long jump.


Kitty Steele, long-time women's tennis coach at High Point University, was inducted on May 23, 1993 into the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Hall of Fame. The induction took place at the Hall of Fame dinner in conjunction with the NAIA National Tennis Championships in Overland Park, Kansas. Kitty's tennis teams have compiled an overall record of 251 wins and 54 losses in fifteen years, winning nine Carolinas Conference championships, two NAIA District 26 titles, three North Carolinas AIAW titles and advancing to the NAIA national Tournament nine times during the 1980's. Her 1982 and 1983 teams both finished fourth in the nation. Mrs. Steele was named Carolinas Conference Coach of the Year nine times, NAIA District 26 Coach of the Year three times and coached a total of nine NAIA All-American players. In addition to her tennis duties, Mrs. Steele coached the women's field hockey team for fourteen years, winning three North Carolina state championships. She is an Associate Professor in the Physical Education department and was named High Point University's 1992 "Teacher of the Year". Mrs. Steele becomes the fifth person with High Point University connections to be inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame. The others are: Gene Littles, Roger Watson, Jerry Steele, and Chuck Hartman.

## The Evening Degree Program

The Evening Degree Program was begun on the High Point University campus in 1978. A year later the program also began serving on-site the employees of R.J. Reynolds in Winston-Salem. At the request of other companies in this area, the program in 1980 expanded again, leading High Point University and these companies to form PAEDA (Piedmont Area Evening Degree Association). Classes were held for association members at the Thomas H. Davis Training Center of Piedmont Airlines until 1986. Beginning in January 1987, both Winston-Salem divisions moved to a new building erected by High Point University in the Madison Park office development. Since that time, another building has been added to Madison Park and currently a new expansion is underway.

Today, the High Point and Winston-Salem campuses enroll over 1000 students in the Evening Degree Program. Six majors are offered at night: Accounting, Business Administration and Economics, Computer Information Systems, Elementary Education, Industrial and Organizational Psychology, and Psychology. The courses are taught not only by regular High Point University faculty but also by adjunct faculty who are expert practitioners in their fields.

The Evening Degree Program appeals to a large number of people for several reasons: it offers adults the opportunity to earn a degree in four years while working full-time; courses are offered three nights a week in eight-week sessions; students obtain the same number of credits as they would if they were full-time traditional day students; professional staff members keep evening hours at both campuses; and classes are offered year-round.

Additional facts of interest about the Evening Degree Program:

- -The average age of a student is 32
- -The ages of students range from 21 to over 60
- -Over 90% of the students are employed full-time
- -About 85% of students transfer some credit hours
- -The program enrolls about 1000 students in both fall and spring sessions
- -Over 1500 EDP students have graduated from High Point University since 1981

#### THE EDP ALUMNI GROUP

There is currently an alumni group for graduates of the evening program. They are involved in such projects as serving refreshments at registration, Phonathon for EDP scholarships, and hosting the first annual Alumni-EDP Senior Dinner for graduating seniors and their families. Thanks to their dedication, the first awards will be made from the new scholarships to deserving EDP students this fall. 
The following is reprinted from the editorial section of the High Point Enterprise.



Although student life is an active, vital part of the University, alumni involvement is crucial to its success.



### IN MEMORIUM ... DR. JOHN E. WARD, 1941 - 1993

Excerpted from the service address given by Dr. Hal Warlick, Minister to the University



Ralph Waldo Emerson maintained in his essay on "Self-Reliance" that an institution is but "the lengthened shadow of one (person)." Perhaps it is fair generalization to say that a University is in the end but the lengthened shadows of many men and women. Certainly one of the longest shadows making up High Point University will be that of Dr. John Ward. A University is not encompassed or defined by its numbers, its surveys, or its responses to questionnaires. Its identity lies in its people. The High Point University community mourns the loss of Dr. John E. Ward Jr., chairman of the Department of Biology, who died May 29 following a brief illness. John Ward, in many ways, served as the tap root for those values which animated the entity we call High Point University. His value as a teacher was unsurpassed. John Ward cared for each of his students as if he had but one student to care for. His sense of duty picked up where our nature often let down. Though others may stand in his spot, none will be able to take his place. John contributed to our University not only by his superb teaching but also by his friendship. His story and his memory will urge us to be better teachers, more caring colleagues, and less frightened pilgrims on our own terminal journeys. Amid the awareness of the randomness of disease and the uncertainties of life, the only fitting academic response from the University seems to be a simple, Thank you, John! We will see you again in due time. But thank you, John, for what you meant to us.
