


We, the staff, gratefully dedicate the 1955 ZENITH to Mr. Herman E. Coble, who named the ZENITH and served as its first editor.

For your service to your Alma Mater and your untiring efforts as teacher and friend, we dedicate this annual to you.




Formal dedication of the new buildings at High Point College was held October 13 in the new Memorial Auditorium with the student body and numerous guests from High Point and vicinity present.

Weaver M. Marr, resident administrator of the American Humanities Foundation at Salem College, Salem, West Virginia was the speaker for the occasion. Bishop Cossten J. Harrell, of the Western North Carolina Conferences of the Methodist Church, was co-speaker for the dedication.

The new buildings were officially presented by Holt McPherson, chairman of the board of trustees. Also taking part in the service were Dr. J. Clay Madison, Dr. C. Excelle Rozelle, and Mr. F. Logan Porter, Reverend J. Clyde Aumian, and Dr. Dennis Cooke, President of High Point College.

Susanna Wesley Hall, Dormitory for Women; Memorial Auditorium and Music Hall; a science and home economics building; and maintenance building are the structures that were dedicated.

Student Government activities this year at High Point College have reached an unprecedented high mark in the level of campus activities. This past year especially, the student body has become more aware of student government, due both to its activities and its importance.

High Point College students believe in self government, democracy, and the principles of self honor. For this reason, student government is effective in campus life. This year, the Student Government Association, under the leadership of its well liked and efficient president, David Abernathy, has set new goals for future years, as well as making a few records for itself in the year's activities.

The most important goal achieved was the establishment of a new form of government. The present one-council set-up was changed to a three department form of government, executive, legislative, and judiciary. Under the leadership of David Abernathy, a student committee drew up a proposed constitution and submitted it to the student body for ratification; it was heartily accepted by a vote of 845-6. The new government replaced the Student Council which had been in operation since 1934. Of the change in government, Dr. Dennis H. Cooke, president of the college stated, "It is

the most progressive change I have seen within the student body since I have been president of this institution. I was certainly glad to see it go into operation."

The biggest dance of the college year was held April 27, when the Student Government Association sponsored a concert and dance featuring the band of Ralph Marterie. The event was an overwhelming success, enjoyed by the student body as well as by the people of the city of High Point. This was the first time in the history of the College that a "big name" band had been obtained for an all-college social function.

Among other activities were assembly programs held by the SGA several times throughout the year, sponsoring a successful freshman orientation program, holding open house after home basketball games, conducting a fund-raising campaign for a new gymnasium, sending six delegates to the state-wide Student Legislative Assembly in Raleigh, N. C., and countless other things that are almost inestimable.

David Abernathy and this year's council are to be commended, not only for the work they did this year but also for the plans, thought and consideration they gave to the present enrollment as well as to the many students to come to High Point College in the future.

The Student Christian Council functions for the purpose of planning and guiding the religious activities on campus. The council is made up of four officers, two committees and two representatives from each religious organization on campus.

It has been the policy of the council to hold two retreats annually, one at the beginning of each semester in order to plan out their semester's program. Sandwiched in between these retreats, they hold several meetings to view the results of

their plans and discuss problems that usually come to the attention of the group.

Among the many things planned by the council are religious emphasis week, weekly vespers programs, morning devotions and the mid-week prayer service.

The Student Christian Council strives to improve the religious opportunities here at H.P.C. They attempt tirelessly and prayerfully to plan each phase of their program in the best interest of the spiritual health of High Point College.

Student Christian Council Activities

"Hey, let's go to morning devotions. . . . Prayer service on Wed. night. . . . See you at vespers Sunday. . . . Who did you say the speaker for Religious Emphasis Week is. . . . Vassiliki Fund Drive for 1954." . . . These are a few of the most important religious events that take place on our campus for the student body.

Morning devotions are held each morning at 8:00, Monday through Saturday in Lindley Chapel. They have a two-fold purpose, one to provide daily inspiration for both students and faculty; it also seeks to establish a better relation between the student and faculty members in that a faculty member is in charge of the brief service three days weekly as are the students.

The mid-week prayer service is another activity that is significant on our campus. It strives to deepen the prayer life of students and to encourage prayer.

Vespers on Sunday—one might call this the High Point College Church Service. Generally the services are handled by the organizations and faculty members on campus; however, several times each semester, the S.C.C. invites special guests to visit our campus. Among our guests this year was a group from Bennett College.

Religious Emphasis Week is one of the S.C.C.'s

major activities of the year. They usually start planning for this occasion a semester in advance. They have brought many outstanding speakers to our campus during the past few years and this year was no exception. With Dr. Robert N. DuBose delivering the messages, this year's religious emphasis week was termed as one of the best, probably because of the informal atmosphere that was created by both the S.C.C. and the speaker.

Each year the S.C.C. gives the student body the opportunity to contribute to the welfare of Vassiliki, a fifteen-year old Grecian girl whom the S.C.C. supports. The council sends Vassiliki money and other supplies approximately four times a year.

In these activities briefly mentioned above and in all other religious activities carried on here at H.P.C., the S.C.C. along with the other religious organizations on campus has the ever-lasting desire to see "Peace on earth, and good will toward men" become a living reality here on earth. All of the religious organizations, Baptist and Methodist, Fellowship Teams and the S.C.C., Alpha Delta Theta and Kappa Chi, carry and believe "Christ Above All" . . . Nil Sine Numine . . . nothing without divine guidance.




Fellowship Teams






