





Under a beautiful blue sky, the class of 2005 gathered one last time to say goodbye to High Point University and to share their accomplishments with friends and family.








Orientation Week 2005 was a lightning-fast, non-stop, fun-filled series of events and activities designed to capture the essence of what is "High Point!"
