



Women's Basketball

High Point University's women's baskethall team boasted a young roster with no seniors on the 11-member squad and just three juniors. The Panthers finished second in the Big South standings after defeating perennial power Liberty in the final game of the season.



Sophomore Jurica Hargraves earned a spot on the Big South All-Conference First Team after leading the team in scoring all season, averaging 13.2 points per game. Classmate Mackenzie Maier was named to the Second Team All-Conference and grabbed a spot on the All-Tournament team. Maier tallied 84 blocks this season (2.7 bpg), setting a new HPU single season record; she also set a school single game record (7, two times) and a Big South Tournament record with seven against UNC Asheville. Shamia Brown was named the Big South Freshman of the Year. She was second on the team in scoring with 11.2 points per game and led the team in rebounding with 5.9 per game.


